This photograph was taken while feeding the swans and ducks on our riverbank, the swan was attempting to scare off the ducks that were being greedy! We are privileged to have the swan family back for a second year to breed, this year they have raised 7 beautiful offspring!

Environmental Agency Report - In this year's survey at Byfleet we recorded eleven different species of fish. Chub and roach were the most abundant species, with chub



being dominant in terms of biomass. The catch included several large chub up to 5lb, barbel to 4lb, as well as a number of large eels. Compared to previous years, density and biomass values in 2009 are slightly below the long term average for this site, although remain above average for the River Wey as a whole. Overall, the site continues to support a very healthy and diverse population of fish and this is testament to the high quality of habitat found here.

Invasive Weed - Himalayan Balsam (*Impatiens glandulifera*) is a large annual plant, native to the Himalaya which grows to 1 to 2 meters high, with a soft green or redtinged stem, with pink flowers and exploding seed pods. The crushed foliage has a strong musty smell. It has taken over the river bank in great swathes and should be pulled out at every opportunity!

Bin Collection Changes – Please note that that our collection day for the wheelie bins has now changed from Wednesday to **Monday** effective Monday 14th September 2009 (black) [28th September 2009 (black) 5th October (blue)] As of next year there will also be an additional bin for weekly food waste. If it is not a Monday, please make sure that all your bins are stored within the confines of your property.



Security – If you use one of the gates that requires a Weymede Residents' key (river, compound or woodland access), please be sure to leave it locked behind you. If you have an issue with the procedure or are aware of people that leave it unlocked, please bring it to the attention of the committee.
